WHAT IS NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP (NFP)?

NFP is a home visiting program for first time moms, who are less than 29 weeks pregnant.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Nurses from Oakland County Health Division visit you at home while you are pregnant and for the first two years of your baby's life.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

A home visiting nurse will help you learn about:

- 1. What to expect during pregnancy
- 2. How your baby grows and develops
- 3. Parenting skills

- 4. Being independent
- 5. Community resources

WHO CAN SIGN UP?

This free service is for first time moms living in specific areas throughout Oakland County. Clients must be eligible for WIC or Medicaid to participate in NFP but enrollment in these programs is not required. For more information, call 1-800-848-5533 or email <u>NOC@oakgov.com</u>.
