GROSS MOTOR MILESTONES

for children birth to three



- · Follows objects with eyes
- · Turns head side to side on tummy
- Lifts head to 45 degrees on tummy
- · Brings hands to midline
- · Props on elbows on tummy when placed
- Grasps objects at midline



- Brings hands/feet to mouth
- Pivoting on tummy
- Rolls tummy to back & back to tummy
- Reaches and gets on extended arms on tummy
- Sits with support



- Sits independently when placed
- Moves backwards on tummy/army crawls
- · Pushes up on hands and knees
- Gets in/out of sitting independently
- Crawls on hands/knees
- Pulls to tall kneeling



- Pulls to stand
- Sits down from supported standing
- Cruises along furniture
- Stands alone momentarily

- Gets into standing independently
- Walks with or without support
- Squats to pick up toys with or without support
- Follows simple directions



- · Walks well alone
- Carries objects while walking
- Walks in all directions (sideways, backwards, can change directions)
- Walks fast



- Steps over objects
- Steps up/down from an elevated step with or without support
- Squats to pick up toys from the floor and regains standing
- Runs, but may fall often



- Develops jumping skills: jumping up, forward, and down from elevated surface
- · Runs well with good balance
- · Kicks a stationary ball
- Initiates standing on one leg for several seconds
